Board Briefs 8-21-2021

Did you know we have a coach? Susan Wilson, LWVC Coach, has been assigned to be a coach to our local League and will be assisting us in planning and achieving our goals. Susan joined the Board at their retreat held on Aug. 21, 2021. She reviewed the League Structure: National/State/Bay Area/US. She clarified that our League may adopt position established by Leagues in other state. We may also act based upon either National or California League's positions (also known as vertical positions).

The Board reviewed the following guidelines--

League Non-Partisan Policy: Members who are appointed to represent our League on a board or commission as a representative of the League must operate within the positions of the League and must remain non-partisan, neither supporting nor opposing any political candidate.

Speaking with One Voice: Only the President speaks for the League. Members of the League Observer Corps are just that—Observers. An Observer may not speak on behalf of the League when observing public meetings, unless so assigned by the President

Committees: Our President, Donna Roper and Susan Wilson reviewed our local League's Committee Structure with assignments listed under each committee. Committee chairs agreed to develop annual goals to support our mission and areas of emphasis adopted last January.

Board Meetings: The Board will continue meeting once a month via Zoom for now. Board meeting dates and times are listed on our website calendar.

National Voter Registration Day

National Voter Registration Day is celebrated every year on the fourth Tuesday of September. First celebrated in 2012, it is a nonpartisan civic holiday that celebrates our democracy, and one that involves the collective efforts of thousands of volunteers, nonprofit organizations, businesses, schools, libraries, election officials, and more from all over the country. This year, National Voter Registration Day will take place on September 28, 2021.

The goal is to register 1 million new voters by 2022, reaching a total of 5.5 million new voters that have registered on the holiday across all fifty states and the District of Columbia since 2012. National Voter Registration Day is supported by the National Association of Secretaries of State (NASS), the National Association of State Election Directors (NASED), the National Association of Election Officials (Election Center) and the U.S. Election Assistance Commission (EAC). In Sonoma County, the League will be registering voters at various locations, such as libraries and farmers markets, throughout that whole week in September. Come out and join us!

Advocacy Notes

We took some time off in August. But we're back with a busy agenda. We have some big ideas for the months ahead. First, we want to jumpstart our advocacy efforts around affordable housing and homelessness. We had a guest speaker, Gen Klose, the executive director of Generation Housing (GenH) https://generationhousing.org at our recent meeting. She outlined reasons for the housing shortage and its impact on communities as well as possible solutions. We are looking for a member who would like to work on this critical issue. Another hot button issue that came to the attention of our committee was the proposed rail transport of coal via Marin and Sonoma County then north to Humboldt Bay. The Press Democrat wrote a detailed article on September 3rd about this controversial plan and the cast of characters involved from politicians, Indian tribes, businesspeople, and environmentalists. Advocacy voted to ask our Board to oppose the proposal by the little-known corporation out of Wyoming. Meanwhile we, reached out to our leagues in Mendocino and Humboldt counties to see if they would like to add their voices. This is all going on as we go to print.

Finally, the committee chair reviewed our goals for the next few months. They are, in short:

- Recruit a co-chair for advocacy,
- Identify someone who would like to oversee advocacy on housing & homelessness,
- Promote at least two public events over the next several months.

We welcome new members to Advocacy committee and to either of our subcommittees on climate change and criminal justice. We meet on the first Tuesday of every month at 10:30 AM.


Get to Know More about Our Web Site


The login button is in the top right corner of the screen the screen:

Once you are logged, in the screen will change slightly. The most noticeable difference will be the addition of the *Members Resources* option. Hover your cursor over that option to get to the *Membership Directory*, which is never made available to non-members. There you can also find references specific to the operation of the League, like our *By Laws* and *Policies*. Members will also see additional events that are intended primarily for members.

The screen you will see will look basically like this:



The first thing you will probably notice is the slide show, a rotating collection of pictures of Sonoma County and our League activities. We are hoping to be able to add some newer ones as we emerge from this pandemic and can meet in person again. If you have a picture that you would like to contribute, you can send it to <u>communitations@lwvsonoma.org</u>.

In the **header** at the top, you will find a variety of options. In the far upper left you will now see your name. Go there to get to your *Profile*, for example. You can hover your cursor over a tab and then click on the option you choose, or if there are no sub-options, such as *Home*, just click on the option. There will be more about the various options in future articles, but for now explore and see what you can find. This header, as well as the footer, in blue at the bottom, will appear on most pages, making it easy to navigate around the site.

To the left of the slide show is a list of *Upcoming Events*. You can click on an event to get more complete information about the event. You can also see a complete calendar of events under the tab *News and Events*.

Below the slide show to the left you will see as list recent **newsletters** and **other articles**. Again, click on any of these to see the full publication. You can find a more extensive list under *News and Events*.

In the center, below the slide show, you will see our most recent Facebook post. Clicking on that will take you to our Facebook page. To the right of that are some other important links: to *Voters Edge*, where you can find your ballot, important information about candidates and ballot measures, and other election information; and to our local *League YouTube Channel*, which includes videos of candidate forums and other useful information.

Gods of the Upper Air: How a Circle of Renegade Anthropologists Reinvented Race, Sex, and Gender in the Twentieth Century, Charles King, 467 pages, 2019

"In *Gods of the Upper Air*, Charles King departs from his field of political science to chronicle the birth of cultural anthropology at the start of the twentieth century, writing about the scientists who "found themselves on the front lines of the greatest moral battle of our time: the struggle to prove that—despite difference of skin color, gender, ability, or custom—humanity is one undivided thing" The concerns of the heroes in *Gods of the Upper Air* have much in keeping with the sociopolitical topics that have driven American discourse since 2016: immigration, nationalism, race relations.,
